 $\hfill\square$ Parish Annual Survey 2022 will be available by direct digital link

 \Box Survey was to be available as of October 15, 2022

 \Box Each council may decide how to complete the survey, as a group at an Executive meeting or it may be completed by the President and/or Secretary

□ Parish, Diocesan, and Provincial Presidents must still produce a narrative Annual Report summarizing their individual council's achievements and send these up to the next level

6. **New Annual Per Capita Fees:** New Annual Fee due to National Office is \$25/member. More info at: https://cwl.ca/communique-5-secretary-treasurer/

7. Life Membership: Effective immediately, the moratorium is lifted

a. Amended criteria:

• Nominees living in Ontario must have allowed their name to stand for provincial office.

• Nominees living in provinces without dioceses must have served as provincial past president at the anticipated date of presentation.

• Nominees must provide a comprehensive list of League experience, including past workshops,

presentations, and research.

- The nomination fee would be set at \$300.00.
- Nominations at all levels would be held by secret ballot.

b. New requirements:

 $\hfill\square$ Life members will be polled by the national chairperson of organization biennially to update their

status, ability and willingness to be involved.

Note: The deadline for Notice of Nomination to National Office has been extended to September 30, 2022 for this year only

Alberta Mackenzie President's Report 2022 Delivered at National Convention in Kelowna



Madam Chair,

Alberta Mackenzie Provincial Council is comprised of 159 councils in Alberta and the Northwest Territories with a membership of over 8,000 faith filled women in 5 dioceses who with gratitude and joy are **Catholic and Living It**! We proudly celebrated ABMK members: Fran Lucas, Cathy Bouchard & Dorothy Johansen as they assumed their responsibilities on National Council. Our members strived to meet the challenges of COVID fatigue and creatively did their best to connect with one another and keep councils intact. There was a renewed sense of caring for members and the strengthening of relationships and how we "do things" as an organization. We were reminded what a wonderful gift the League is. We celebrated 100-year anniversaries for Calgary & Edmonton Diocesan Councils, St. Francis Xavier Council in Camrose & Holy Name of Jesus Council in Vermillion.

Provincial council dedicates itself to promoting the many initiatives of National Council as well as a few of their own. Members embraced the *Gratitude Project* and hundreds of gratitude postcards & baskets were prepared for first responders, parish staff, medical staff, etc. Other initiatives included Development and Peace, Missions Canada and CNEWA. One council planted 100 seedling trees and dedicated a park bench in a popular community green space.

A focus of the provincial council is to educate. We continued our work to inform our members and the communities they live in about the insidious devastation of pornography. We continued to support and educate others about *Sanctity of Life* issues. Medical Assistance in Dying, Euthanasia and Abortion have become increasingly popularized. Our faith has strengthened our resolve to be involved and share the Pro-Life position in these issues. We actively participated in the *Alberta March for Life* and accepted an invitation to speak at their rally.

We continued to promote the right to publicly funded Catholic Education through GrAce which is an acronym for Grateful Advocates of Catholic Education. The Alberta Bishops, Catholic School Board Trustees and the Catholic Superintendents founded this group and invited the Catholic Women's League in Alberta to participate by spreading the good news about Catholic education. The Catholic school system in Alberta is the last **publicly funded institution** that can speak freely about God thereby having the important opportunity to teach about the inherent dignity of the individual and the sanctity of life from conception to natural death.

We did not meet with our provincial government this past year but we do have one resolution for consideration: **Resolution 2022:01 Federal Legislation to Reduce Food Loss & Waste**.

Mindful of the League Prayer which entreats *"Teach us to share at home and abroad the good things you have given us"* members at the 75th Annual Provincial Convention voted the approval of financial donations to help the flood victims in Hay River, NWT, to help with the ongoing Ukraine relief & settlement efforts as well as a contribution to offset the cost of the Papal Visit. Additionally, members throughout ABMK have helped through their prayers, fundraising and efforts to resettle families escaping the war in Ukraine.

Our council meets in St. Albert at the Star of the North Retreat Centre, as it is central for all the dioceses. We were able to make a legacy donation to their renovations and were delighted when they advised that the beautiful "new" chapel would be named the *Our Lady of Good Counsel Chapel*.

Honorary Life member Ardis Beaudry & Life Members Sheila Houle & Anne Laskosky returned to the Lord and have found a special place in His Heavenly Kingdom.

Alberta Mackenzie members were involved in the various Strategic Planning Working Groups. Many valuable resources were gifted to us by National Council that will serve as tools in recruiting & maintaining membership, filling leadership positions & meeting the needs of an aging population. As members of the Catholic Women's League in Alberta Mackenzie guided by our faith and by our hopeful optimism in the inspired vision of the Strategic Plan, our dedicated leadership plans to focus on relationships, renewal and effecting change

This report was written as we wait in anticipation of the *Walking Together* visit of Pope Francis in the prayerful hope it will usher in a new era of understanding, reconciliation, healing and a new beginning in our relationship with our Indigenous *family* and a way to encourage conversation with our Indigenous sisters. We are **One in the Spirit**, women entrusted by God to the well-being of our society as rooted in our children and grandchildren. Many of our members have joined the ranks of volunteers preparing for this historic visit and if asked will undoubtedly have poignant memories to share.

We hope to make a difference with our Catholic sisters one woman at a time by living our calling to faith, service and social justice confident in the knowledge that we truly are *Catholic & Living It!*
